We had 8 PAC members and 1 Network Member Trained in CPR First Aid A total of 82 Naloxone kits were distributed to peers and the community. We moved into a new location that has shower and kitchen access for peers to use. We had 4 new Peer/PAC engagements within our PAC We Distributed 3,000 Condoms at Country fest and provided training to the first aid tents with Nasal Naloxone for the festival.

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COOL THING:

We hosted capacity trainings in Naloxone use, HIV & HEP C Info and, First Aid/CPR. We organized 3 STBBI Treatment events engaging over 15 service providers in providing a Harm Reduction Health Fair, with community services including STBBI Testing, Walk-in Clinic, Registered Drug Testing, Naloxone Training, HIV Self Test Kits, Health and Dental Information and housing supports.

PEERS IDENTIFIED A NEED:

Three peers participated in OPTIMA : Making the case for shared decision making in opiod use disorder care. From 2017-2020, researchers with the Canadian Research Initiative on Substance Misuse (CRISM) launched OPTIMA - a clinical trial aimed at investigating a more flexible model of care than methadone to treat opioid use disorder.

In order to effectively meet people where they are at our office was relocated to a more accessible and central location. This has opened the door to meet new peers and create new partnerships with the network.

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PEERS In the park

The Peers in the Park knowledge sharing project was informed by the outcomes of the Harm Reduction Client Survey conducted by the Manitoba Harm Reduction Network in 2021. For 10 weeks "Peers in the Park" sessions were held every Friday at a local park where peers shared education on harm reduction and STBBIs with other peers. Sessions ended with a meal, discussion and supply distribution.

- 48 unique peers that attended and participated
- 94% of participants learned something new at the sessions that will help keep them safe.
- 86% percent of participants found the session they attended very helpful.
- People preferred to get information from peers that they trusted and/or have similar lived experience.



IN OUR COMMUNITY, OUR ACTIONS SPEAK FOR THEMSELVES

We also participated in a provincial satellite site distribution program to increase harm reduction supply access to peers. Through this program we distributed Injection supplies (6662 needles), smoking supplies (2472 meth pipes, 121 safer crack use kits), safer sex supplies, 78 naloxone kits, sharps containers, food, and hygiene products.

For Pride we had Pride rainbow crosswalks painted semi-permanently in three of our communities with the help of the Peer Advisory Council.

We created personal garden planters for each peer of the Peer Advisory Council members, each came with their favourite vegetables to plant, a teaching on harvesting and utilizing the most of your garden harvest.

PEERS IDENTIFIED A NEED:

The Northwest Interlake hosted a peer run satellite distribution site based out of Pinaymootang that distributed over 1000 bubble pipes to decrease the injection use of meth. This also allowed for access to clean supplies, which in turn lessens the transmission of STBBI's.

ALSO The network received a mental health grant, which was used for a "dignity closet". This gave peers access to toiletries, menstrual products, underwear, socks and other supplies identified.

We helped create Peer Voices, a peer-made video on harm reduction.

We learned about First Nation culture and history through the Turtle Island Project. The Turtle Island Project shared oral stories of First Nations communities from pre-contact, contact, colonization and a path forward. We officially launched HIV Self Test Kits alongside I AM - Health in the fall of 2022, enabling community members and loved ones to get immediate, high-quality health information in a setting of their choosing. We hosted First/AID CPR training for 12 peers!

PEERS **IDENTIFIED** A NEED:

We've continued to operate Satellite Supply Distribution sites and provide harm reduction supplies in accessible ways, including flexible time, location and without the barriers of walking into a health center.

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ANOTHER **COOL THING IS:**

We delivered 12 Overdose Prevention and Response Trainings to over 87 participants in Selkirk.

Our February STBBI Treatment event engaged over 20 service providers in providing a Harm Reduction Health Fair.

3 Peers and 11 members participated in the first Harm Reduction 2.0 Training.

Responding to the toxic drug crisis, the Winnipeg Harm Reduction Network hosted a pop up Overdose Prevention Site (OPS) at one of the larger encampments – providing safer drug use supplies, naloxone and naloxone training for the community. In addition we put out multiple drug alerts, warning folks of unexpected outcomes from new drugs arriving on the streets. We continue to work with prescribers and the College of Physicians to create innovative pathways that improve the lives of people who use drugs.

ANOTHER cool thing is:

Sent out 'systems change and safe supply' promo holiday cards to over 60 physicians, politicians and stakeholders in Winnipeg. Supported 3 Satellite Site operators, and collaborated on Safersites.ca website that issues drug alerts and information pertaining to Winnipegs Mobile Overdose Prevention Service (MOPS)

Issued 11 Drug Alerts through the Safersites.ca page reaching 159,072 people
